Throughout 2021, Georgina Trades Training Inc. worked to continue to offer much needed programming to our community both in-person with reduced capacities and virtually. Despite various limitations imposed by the pandemic, we served 364 community members in 2021.

Industry certification courses continued with participants earning certifications in Working at Heights, First Aid and CPR, WHMIS and more. New courses offered in 2021 inlcuded online QuickBooks® training where participants were able to learn from the comfort of their own homes. As the pandemic continues we are looking to continue to expand our online training capabilities and look forward to offering these course in 2022.



Our Skills Education Training ('S.E.T.') program, funded by the Regional Municipality of York, offered training in administration and bookkeeping. Training was offered virtually for four out of the five sessions, with the final session of the year being able to be offered in-person. The Skills Education Training program provides participants with the skills and tools required to find gainful employment. Nineteen of the S.E.T. program graduates went on the find employment following completion of the program and 4 went on to pursue additional education. We would like to wish our S.E.T. students the best of luck in their new career endeavours.

Funding from the New Horizons for Seniors Program allowed the organization to offer training for Georgina Seniors and Youth. Through both in-person and virtual training, seniors and youth participated in workshops to learn about Healthy Cooking, Mixed Media Arts, and Technology. This program offered much needed opportunities for social interaction while learning new skills.

Georgina Trades Training Inc. continues to provide training to meet the labour market needs of the community and looks forward to continuing to serve our clients in 2022.

Message | Director, Skilled Trades Institute Phil Adams



Our first cohort of 108 students started at the Skilled Trades Institute ('S.T.I.') in the middle of COVID-19 on January 5, 2021. We had to be very innovative and nimble to ensure students received the hands-on training required to succeed in learning eight essential trades.

We rented six different buildings at the Salvation Army Summer Camp location on Metro Road in Sutton to give students the required, 'social distance' space to receive effective trades training.

In June 2021, seventy-six students graduated from S.T.I.'s first cohort. Of this first cohort, sixty-two (82%) obtained employment in the trades within seven months of graduation. Some of these graduates have already registered as trade apprentices.

The 2nd cohort commenced on July 5, 2021 at the Kinsmen Club and the Sutton arena. To ensure compliance with public health practices students were again separated for distance and hands-on learning.

The Skilled Trades Institue started with 108 students and graduated ninty-six on December 23, 2021 under adverse conditions.

The organizaion was still impacted by an unprescedented pandemic, students entered the workplace in winter conditions and were required to work in temporary facilities. During the pandemic, we were faced with 300% increase in building material costs, especially wood. Land values in Georgina and the surrounding GTA made affordable low-cost housing 'non affordable'. We were unable to build and sell our potential modular homes and reinvest in STI under these conditions.



The Skilled Trades Institute is very proud of the students who received specialized pre-apprenticeship training with no tuition cost. These students, some of whom have been recognized with an award this year, graduated armed with skills and knowledge that will hold them in good stead as they begin their careers in the trades.

I am so pleased with my decision to be part of this program.

After only six weeks, I feel confident enough to build a shed on my own in the backyard. The class size is perfect to facilitate plenty of hands-on learning and provide all students with the individual attention they require.

I enjoy hearing real-life stories from our experienced, highly skilled instructor, Kory. I like that the program ties into the other trades that the institute offers, providing students with a good understanding of how everything fits together, ultimately turning us into skilled trade workers.

This past year has continued to be a productive one for the Committee. It has amended its name to the Governance & Human Resources Committee to accurately reflect its responsibilities for supporting governance within the organization.

Like most community-based, educational organizations, the navigation of COVID and its protocols had a significant impact on programs, their participants and our employees. We are sad to see the completion of the Skilled Trades Institute project. Although we all hoped for a longer duration of this worthwhile training opportunity in the trades, we are grateful for the work of everyone involved and for the enthusiastic participation of the students while the program was in effect. Their leadership and partnership with Georgina Trades Training Inc. helped to ensure the success of the Skilled Trades Institute.





Message | Chair, Finance Committee Carr Hatch

2021 will be remembered as the year of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, during which the Skilled Trades Institute trained 8 different trades in several different temporary locations in Georgina. In 2021, Georgina Trades Training Inc. received an additional \$2,087,640 from Skills Advance Ontario ('SAO') through the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development ('MLTSD'); this grant totaled \$3,277,390 in 2020/2021.

Georgina Trades Training Inc. received a \$90,054 Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy ('CEWS') from the Federal Government under COVID funding initiatives.

The organization received several grants and donations including \$147,680 from the Regional Municipality of York for the Skills Education Training ('S.E.T.') program.

We continued our mutually supportive partnership with Routes Connecting Communities chartering the Quest bus for various events in the GTA.







The residential construction trades and training programs offered by the Skilled Trades Institute were designed to lead students directly into employment opportunities.

The program included two distinct twenty-six week training modules in the following areas of specialization:

- Cabinetry Pre-Apprenticeship
- · Carpentry Pre-Apprenticeship
- Drywall Pre-Apprenticeship
- Electrical Pre-Apprenticeship
- Flooring Pre-Apprenticeship
- Heating, Ventilation & Air Conditioning Pre-Apprenticeship
- Plumbing Pre-Apprenticeship
- Roofing Pre-Apprenticeship



Tuition was provided at no cost to students and they were also offered additional safety and soft skills training to ensure they were 'job-ready' when they graduated.

A key benefit of the Pre-Apprenticeship Construction trades training program was the availability of career-related services and support. The Skilled Trades Institute assisted students to find a sponsor or employer for potential employment after graduating from the program.

(Skills, Education and Training) for Employment program entered its 12th year of providing career specific training, industry certifications, soft skills training and employability skills with funding through York Region's Community Investment Fund to help York Region Residents gain employment. Students in the program receive industry certifications, soft sills training as well as hands on training reflecting the program they are participating in. All students are connected with employment services and attend various workshops to help them with their employment endeavors.

The Quest Bus



The Quest Bus is an innovative program offered through a mututally supportive partnership in partnership between Georgina Trades Training Inc., Routes Connecting Communities, the Town of Georgina, and the Georgina Chamber of Commerce. The Quest Bus facilitates free and subsidized bus services for Georgina residents. It is generously funded by the Ministry of Transportation. Even during the pandemic, the Quest Bus provided many free trips for the community including much needed rides to the food pantry and local grocery stores.

Challenge. Disruption. Uncertainty.

Like many community-based organizations, the pandemic presented challenges never before confronted or, indeed, contemplated. This was a year in which no amount of planning or prediction could anticipate what would be required and demanded of staff, students and the broader community. The stresses on the organization and its human resources were exacerbated by the launching of the ambitious and complex Skilled Trades Institute. The

Institute personal potential, personal development, innovation and mutually supportive partnerships.

It was full-speed ahead, the end result being the graduation of approximately 170 students from eight Trades pre-apprenticeship programs. None of this would have been possible without a team of fearless, dedicated staff who had a common goal.

As a result of COVID-19, Georgina Trades Training Inc. shifted how it offered programs and services to the community. During a three-month lockdown, Georgina Trades Training Inc. was able to have both its staff and students work remotely thanks to the purchase of laptops.

In 2021, Georgina Trades Training Inc. received a \$139,100 Resilient Communities Fund grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation to outfit its facility and modify transportation services to meet the safety requirements required because of COVID-19.
